Dear Permit Holder/Pool Operator:

Per 902 KAR 10:120 Kentucky Public Swimming and Bathing Facilities Regulation Section 17, prior to opening of a seasonal swimming and bathing facility, your facility must call the local health department before their opening date to request an opening inspection to be conducted. Please call and schedule a date a minimum of one week prior to your projected opening date to ensure your facility can be inspected and give you time to correct violations prior to opening if they are found. Facilities will not be permitted to open if any critical violations are found. Non-critical violations which are found during the regular inspection will become repeat violations if they are found again on the next regular inspection, which may result in the closure of your facility.

Due to the Covid19 outbreak, the opening of pools have been delayed by the Governor's Office till June 29, 2020. To find the guidelines for reopening your facility please visit the Health at Work website <https://govstatus.egov.com/ky-healthy-at-work> and click on Public Swimming and Bathing Facilities. The Permit Fee for your facility will need to be paid as well as your opening inspection performed before you can open. You may pay your permit fee at [www.ltdhd.org](http://www.ltdhd.org) by clicking make a payment and selecting Swimming Pools and Beaches under the Public Facilities tab.

It is your responsibility to ensure that your facility meets all requirements of 902 KAR 10:120, which can be found online at: <http://www.lrc.state.ky.us/kar/902/010/120.htm>. Pool operators and other swimming and bathing facility staff should become familiar with all regulations and make any corrections as needed. During the time when your facility is closed for business is the best time to make corrections rather than closing the pool during the open season and correcting them. Below are some common violations:
